
Celebrating the Heroes Among Us




THE TENGKU'S MOMENT OF TRIUMPH...



The opening of new frontiers in agriculture and advances in education and industry promise a future where ideas are translated into workable solutions for the advancement of Malaysians.










The Award

The Merdeka Award is a prestigious award that aims to recognise and reward citizens and organisations who have made outstanding contributions in their respective fields to the people of Malaysia. It is open to all living Malaysians residing either in Malaysia or abroad. It is benchmarked against international awards of the highest standards and in doing so firmly upholds the credos of excellence and transparency.

It is named the Merdeka Award in celebration of the true spirit of independence which transcends the conventional definition of national sovereignty. It explores the liberation of the mind and spirit – factors which foster the realisation of human potential and the pursuit of excellence. The Merdeka Award aims at the encouragement of going beyond the comfort zone and the creation of a new mindset among Malaysians.

The Merdeka Award encompasses excellence in the broadest sense and the categorisation acknowledges the collective good that stems from the goal of doing one's best.

Award Categories

The Merdeka Award will be presented annually in Kuala Lumpur by the Patron, the Prime Minister of Malaysia in the areas of:

Education & Community

Awarded to individuals and organisations to honour exceptional thinking and research in strengthening the educational infrastructure of Malaysia, in elevating the level of education and in benefiting the marginalised.

Environment


Awarded to individuals and organisations to honour the development, research and application of new technology and practices in renewing and protecting the environment.

Health, Science & Technology

Awarded to individuals and organisations to honour the creation, development, support and application of new and innovative technology that improve the lives of people everywhere.

Outstanding Scholastic Achievement Awarded to a post-graduate fellow for outstanding scholastic merits and academic work of high significance.

Outstanding Contribution to the People of Malaysia Awarded to a citizen of any nationality or a foreign organisation to honour substantial contribution to Malaysia or to the lives of Malaysians in any of the five established categories.

After serving in the Ministry of Information, Dato' Johan Ariff set up his Design Practice and went on to establish a body of work second to none in Malaysia.


Though multidisciplinary, his Practice is largely involved in Corporate Identity commissions. Some of his works are in the permanent collection of the World Trademark Centre, Belgium. He has executed and supervised the largest logo portfolio in the country, including the PETRONAS Logo which was designed 33 years ago.

The Logo and Trophy



MERDEKA AWARD

Designed by Dato' Johan Ariff, the trophy is a three dimensional version of the Merdeka Award logo. It expresses convergence and ascension, the same qualities celebrated in the achievements of the Merdeka Award winners. The trophy also represents environmental concerns in the form of a plant shoot *Rebung*, transparency ethics, and the glorious five decades of Malaysian independence.



Latiff Mohidin

Artist, sculptor and poet Latiff Mohidin is one of Malaysia's pre-eminent artists. He first made an impact on the local art scene at the age of 11. His education in art has taken him to Berlin, Paris and New York, where he developed a strong visual language that permeates his work.

An Artistic Vision of Excellence



This Latiff Mohidin sculpture accompanies the cash award, trophy and scroll to be presented to the winner. Incorporating the kinetic element of a rotating ball symbolising freedom, the sculpture rests on a granite base denoting strength and fortitude. The piece also incorporates the traditional elements of *Sulur Bayur* underscoring heritage and *Pucuk Rebung* signifying excellence.
